Calling all paws Gwinnett Humane Society hosts pet festival

Rhodes Jordan Park will go to the dogs - and cats - this weekend.

Link is the author of the newly release book "Wagging Tales," a collection of stories about animals he has worked with to build better relationships with their owners.

Link will offer private consultations with pet owners throughout Saturday's event.

At noon, rain or shine, individuals and teams will take a walk around the park in the 16th annual Paw Parade, which raises money to support GHS programs and services. Gwinnett Braves mascot Chopper will be honorary grand marshal, and registration for the parade will begin at 11 a.m. The registration fee is \$25 per team or individual.

"The Pawfest is a great event, great organization, a lot of fun as well," Link said. "I encourage people to come out and have a fun day with their pets."
